Breakfast casseroles and sweets were served, along with refreshments. 30 plus ladies from 6 churches were in attendance. Jeana Fors, introduced the program for the morning. Diane Crock from Hope House in Galesburg and Casey Greig with Safe Harbor, also in Galesburg, each spoke on what their businesses do for the people of Knox County. An offering was taken and \$551 was divided in half and given to our program speakers and NIS Women Organization. A short business meeting was conducted by Kathy Jenssen, Convenor. 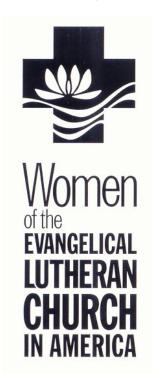
St. John's, Rock Island hosted the 2024 Spring Assembly in April. The program presented therapy dogs and the important role they can play in our lives.
