When our girls were younger, I was an assistant coach for soccer, softball and volleyball.

Why do you wish to serve in this area of ministry in the Synod? I have nearly 30 years of experience in various organizations in the role of finance/accounting management and believe I can share those experiences and gifts with the Northern Illinois Synod office.

What are your priorities for this ministry? I plan to continue the fiscal responsibility of the current financial leadership (Tammie Farley and Pastor Pat Esker). I am also concerned because I know that, sometimes, pastors stress congregations, and we need to engage with that challenge. Before I even knew about the possibility of running for this position, I was dreaming of ways to help pastors to be healthy servants of the church, and I feel like this opportunity is a dream come true and a prayer answered.

What are your priorities for this ministry? First, the Ministry Support Committee and the Bishop have already done a lot of good work. My first priority is to listen to and learn about this more fully, then build on it.

Listening is big for me, so my second priority is to reach out to the rostered leaders of the synod to learn what their concerns are, as well as what gives them strength and joy. I was trained in qualitative research in a graduate program in communication, and I could bring these skills to discern the concerns and strengths of rostered leaders by personal interviews and computerized input.

Depending on what our rostered clergy and congregations say, I would try to learn about the best practices of other synods and even other denominations. We can always learn from others.

In the long term - and it may take years to get to this point - I would want to help facilitate help for rostered leaders and congregations that are on the margin and overly stressed. A lot of times, it seems that we don't learn about stressful situations until it is too late, but, I would hope that we as a synod could provide a safe and healthy atmosphere to dissipate unhealthy situations.

Finally, when rostered leaders have been forced to leave their calls before they anticipated and when congregations are struggling because they don't get along with their pastors, I would like to see help provided, possibly including spiritual counseling, life coaching, emotional therapy, and financial aid... not that the synod or committee could provide all of this, but that the parties involved could be directed to resources that can help them.
